#### 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

Most of the practices which have been introduced in the last few sessions were carried forward in the current session. An educational two day event "Saarthak" was organized at the college level in which each department participated. Saarthak has helped our students twofold: academic and non-academic. 
